- Sit for 30 minutes to enjoy a long picture book
- Focus on the content of the book
- Enjoy traditional tales, silly stories, poetry, and informational text
- Read picture books with the same characters and similar plot elements
- Begin to prefer silent reading

- Know spelling-sound correspondences for common vowel teams (i.e., ew, oy, oi, ought)
- Recognize and read irregularly spelled two-syllable words (i.e., *ruby, even*)
- Decode 3- syllable word that follows a regular vowel pattern (*remember, entertain, Washington*)
- Decode words with common suffixes (ed, er, ing, es, ly, y, er, ier, iest)
- Read a 1R text with sufficient accuracy and fluency
- Ask and answer who, what, where, when, why, and how questions to demonstrate understanding




- Build stamina and finish 1 Chapter Book Each Week: 2R readers begin 2R as picture book readers and leave as chapter book readers.
- Enjoy informational text, prose, and poetry
- Develop the habit of silent reading
- Decode All Multi-Syllabic and Irregularly Spelled Words Familiar from Everyday Speech
- Decode words with common prefixes (*un, re, mis*) and suffixes (*able, ful, tion, ly*)
- Decode 3-syllable words

- Use rules of syllabication
- Read with sufficient accuracy and fluency to support comprehension
- Ask and answer who, what, where, when, why, and how questions to demonstrate understanding of key details
