


# eBook Options from Pasco County School District

## MyPascoConnect

You can find a link to your student's MyPascoConnect at the district website "pasco.k12.fl.us" and clicking on the "Students" tab at the middle and top of the site.



You can access the MyPascoConnect link by scrolling down the "Students" page on the left side. If you do not know your child's password there is also a link with directions on finding that information.




Student will login into MyPascoConnect with student number and silly password








## Axis360


Opening up Axis360 from MyPascoConnect should automatically log them in. If an error occurs the login ID is their student number. They may browse through books available and check out copies to read online. Any books checked out can be found in "My Stuff" at the top right of the screen.



Once you click on a title you will be able to tell if there are copies available. You may click on the "Checkout" tab to place this in the student's library.




On your computer you may click on "Read Now" to open up the book and read in within the browser (ie – Chrome, Safari, FireFox, Internet Explorer). If you would prefer to access the books on a phone or tablet you may use the Axis360 app and download the book. Again, the login for the app is the student ID but you will need to choose your school's library.



### Bookshelf (American Reading Company)

Opening up Bookshelf from MyPascoConnect will automatically log your student in. You may click on the your student's reading level to pull up the correct books.




Once a book is pulled up the navigation is controlled by the arrow keys.




### Follett Shelf


After Follett Shelf is pulled up a key word search is available or the tabs on the left side can be used to look for books.




Once you have chosen a book you may click on it and choose "Open Book"




You will need to login at this point. The user name is the **student ID** and the password is "**pasco**" for all students.



You may need to adjust the picture/font size by clicking on the "Aa" on the top right of the page. You may then "Zoom Out", "Fit to Height" or width. You can also change the Layout and Screen color.



After the book is open you may navigate using the arrow keys.

## State Reptile

AMERICAN ALLIGATOR



In 1987 the Florida legislature designated the American alligator (*Alligator mississippiensis*) as the official state reptile. Long an unofficial symbol of the state, the alligator originally symbolized Florida's extensive untamed wilderness and swamps. Alligators are found throughout Florida and in parts of other southeastern states. They prefer lakes, swamps, canals, and other wetland habitats.
